If a prisoner requests Panadol within the recommended timeframes or over the maximum dose, remind them of the limits - these exist to protect *their health and wellbeing*.



REMEMBER

You have the 'right to refuse' to provide Panadol if the prisoner refuses to follow the provision requirements for their safety – just make sure you record why.



Providing Medication (Panadol)

If you (as a Corrections Officer) provide Panadol within the law and within operating manual guidelines:

- Your practice is safe.
- The prisoner is safe.



These things are very important. Keep this card with you at all times.

When a Prisoner requests Panadol you need to check the prisoner has no health reason recorded why they must not be given Panadol; they have not had Panadol in the last 4 hours; or will exceed the maximum of 8 Panadol in 24 hours.

If the prisoner can be given Panadol, follow the 'RIGHTS' -

- RIGHT prisoner
 Who requested Panadol
- RIGHT medicine Panadol/Paracetamol, check the packaging label

- RIGHT dose
 Maximum of 2 (two) x 500mg tablets
- Not within 4 hours of previous dose
- RIGHT consumption
 Swallowed in front of you with water
- RIGHT documentation Panadol Log Sheet

Follow the 'RIGHTS' – every time.
This keeps everyone safe and
minimises opportunity for hoarding
and misuse of Panadol as this is
dangerous to a person's health.
